Section 4: First-Aid Measures

Description of first aid measures:

In case of inhalation: Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. Seek immediate medical attention. In case of skin contact: If on skin, rinse well with running water for a minimum of 15 minutes. Seek immediate medical attention if any adverse effects occur.
